COASTAL STORM RISK MANAGEMENT STUDY



The U.S Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and Charlotte County are evaluating coastal storm risk management measures along the Gulf of Mexico coastline of Manasota Key as part of the Charlotte County Coastal Storm Risk Management (CSRM) study, authorized by Section of the River and Harbor Act of 1930, Public Law 71-250, as amended by Section 103 of the River and Harbor Act of 1960, Public Law 86-645. The overall purpose of the study is to evaluate alternatives to reduce coastal storm risk to properties and infrastructure located within the Charlotte County, Florida study area.

WHAT IS A COASTAL STORM RISK MANAGEMENT STUDY?

A USACE-conducted Coastal Storm Risk Management (CSRM) study analyzes potential coastal storm risks in a specific area and proposes strategies to manage those risks, often including structural, nonstructural, or nature-based solutions to protect populations and infrastructure from damages caused by coastal storms and sea level change.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENTS

The public meeting held on January 22, 2025 will provide an overview of the study and will allow time for questions. Two in-person and virtual option presentation-style meetings will be offered to accommodate schedules. The first session will be held virtually from 1:00 to 2:00 PM and the second session will be in-person from 5:00 to 6:00 PM.
