Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting training is an FAA annual requirement and must be conducted on fires using props such as aircraft fuselage, motors, and brake assemblies. Fire crews currently travel to complete this training, and the costs and availability of other facilities is an uncontrolled factor. The construction of an Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting Facility (ARFF) would allow Charlotte County fire crews to train locally and would provide a platform for other organizations to train here.

Purpose:

Provide a training platform for County firefighters to support the county airport. This training is required to maintain FAA certification and allow PGD to receive commercial flights.

Objectives:

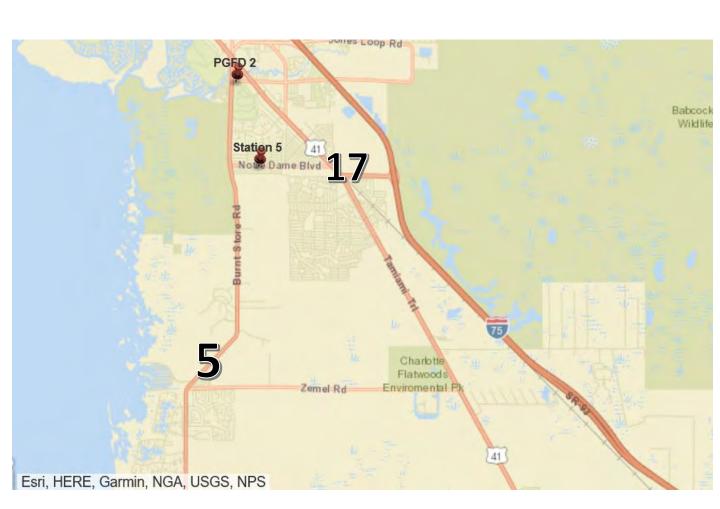
